What is it?

Teach for America recruits outstanding and diverse leaders to become TFA “corps members.” Corps members commit to teaching for two years in a low-income community, where you are employed by local schools and confront both the challenges and joys of expanding opportunities for kids.

After two years, you become part of the TFA alumni network. Informed and inspired by their students, many Corps Members continue teaching; others pursue other leadership roles in schools and school systems or launch careers in other fields that shape educational access and opportunity.

If you are Interested in a career that makes a difference in the community, a job through Teach for America (TFA) is a fantastic opportunity to do so! They are interested in recruiting TheDream.US Scholars to be part of a movement to change the future for America’s students, while gaining invaluable leadership experience that will fuel your career.
